Tignish Recreation Director and Western PEI Community Navigator Steering Committee Member!



**Tina is the definition of welcoming!** If you are ever lucky enough to get to work an event with her, you can feel her positive energy and friendly spirit from a mile away!

Born and raised in the Norway, PEI, Tignish has always been home for Tina. **She is passionate about her community and does everything she can to make it a better place for all.** She graduated from local high school, Westisle Composite, and then spent the next several years caring for seniors in their homes. Tina lived with the seniors as she cared for them and this allowed her see her potential to connect with people and really get to know who they are. Eventually, she and her husband started their family of four and they are proud to raise their kids in the community they called home...now Tina is excited to share this home with many others!

Tina has been the Tignish Recreation Director for two years and it has been an exciting position. Long before she took on this role, she was deeply involved in her community, having started coaching hockey at just 18 years old, volunteering for winter carnivals, Irish Moss Festivals, and Hockey Schools. Tina loves sports, both organizing and playing them! Over the last few years, she has noticed a positive change that their community is growing with many new residents and newcomers filling local labour shortages and moving into the community, now calling Tignish home.

Tina, why is it important to welcome newcomers and new residents to our rural communities? "Everyone needs to feel comfortable. When people move here, it is for a reason...so we need to be welcoming, treat others fairly, equally, and be open & inviting to accept new people."

Tina noted that it is nice to see people who are new to the community branching out into other jobs, as it gives you more of a chance to get to meet them and know them better. Newcomers and new residents are active with local activities and the hope is to continue to see this grow. **Tina understands the important role that sports play with cultural integration and so she hopes to see further integration amongst cultures playing together on teams or competitions playing against each other.** "If a recreational hockey team is short a player, people want to be able to call on their neighbour, no matter how long they have lived in the area or where they come from, to come play on the team and have fun!"

Looking ahead, Tignish will be planning a full day Christmas event on December 5th. It is at the end of the building, the door shared with another new business, Uneed Gifts.


Inside, you'll find a variety of metal products including shelving and household items, but their primary focus is metal ceiling tiles and wall access panels.

Lindee asked Anthony why he settled on opening his shop in Montague, and he said that Montague felt like it has potential for a niche business like this: homes look modern and stylish, and there are plenty of new buildings being built.

On a personal level, Anthony says his family loves it here. He and his wife have a house in Stratford, his son is happy and has lots of friends at school, and they're able to enjoy the slower pace of PEI life. The greenspace that PEI has to offer is high on his list of why PEI is so wonderful. "Mooney's Pond is perfect, it is so beautiful. You don't need to go to Cape Breton to see all the colours [of fall]. It is the perfect place."

Christine, seen in the photo, is the valuable staff member who usually greets you when you arrive, and when we spoke about what PEI life was like in respect to city life, this is what the two of them had to say: "It is slower, less busy. We have time to make dinner here. We never had time to make dinner, so everyone always went out. Back home, your home is quite small so you cannot invite people to your home. Here [pre-pandemic], you can invite your friends to your home because you have space."

#### Thursday, November 5 | Guy Fawkes Day

Guy Fawkes Day, also called Bonfire Night, British observance, celebrated on November 5, commemorating the failure of the Gunpowder Plot of 1605. Today Guy Fawkes Day is celebrated in the United Kingdom, and in a number of countries that were formerly part of the British Empire, with parades, fireworks, bonfires, and food.

#### Wednesday, November 11 | Remembrance Day

Canadians recognize Remembrance Day, originally called Armistice Day, every November 11. At 11 am, we observe a moment of silence to mark the sacrifice of the many who have fallen in the service of their country, and to acknowledge the courage of those who still serve. Many communities honour war veterans with a public Remembrance please check with your municipality to see how they may be commemorating Remembrance Day.

#### Friday, November 13 | World Kindness Day
